#### A BLESSED WEEK AT CAMP!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What a real blessing it was to be able to spend July 23-28 at Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp with 8 awesome youth from Holy Shepherd: Jonathan & Lauren Mahoney, Kale Mason, Matthew Mohrbacher, Karli Patterson, and Edgar, Jade & Gavin Tomlinson.

I've attended Bible camp as a youth, two different camps in lowa as a pastor, and both of our camps in Colorado with youth from Holy Shepherd—Rainbow Trail and Sky Ranch—and I am consistently impressed by the ministries our camps offer to the church! At Sky Ranch, the mission is to offer participants an opportunity to "Encounter Christ on the Mountain". And that's exactly what happened--for our campers and for me.

I invite you to ask our campers about their camp experience, and how they experienced God while at Sky Ranch. I'd like to share some of my "God moments" during my time at Sky Ranch:

- Being invited on a short hike to lovely Beaver Falls by a cabin full of girls, including Karli, and their counselor. I
  was blessed by the conversation, beauty, community, and prayer time led by the girls' counselor, Abby.
- Sitting alongside a mountain stream that runs through camp, reading the lovely poetry of Mary Oliver and writing a bit of my own.
- The hospitality of camp staff, expressed in so many ways--including great food!
- Being included with middle school campers for s'mores and end-of-day worship.
- Engaging in quality conversation about life, camp, church, world, and Christ with camp leadership staff and the pastors and adult leaders present from other congregations.
- 7 AM Bible study—yes, 7 AM—with many of those same leaders. And not having to lead but, rather, being led by capable, competent, confident 20-something Alexa.
- Witnessing the faith, energy, and leadership of young adult camp staff.
- Observing our older kids challenge themselves on the high ropes course, and our younger kids building community as they participated in team-building activities.
- Observing one of our youth comfort a homesick cabin-mate, with an arm around the shoulder and a promise: "It's OK—I'll be here with you until Friday."
- Witnessing and experiencing the unconditional, Christ-like love offered by the camp staff to each other and their camp guests—including me.
- Participating with a room full of youth, staff, and adults in worshipping and singing camp songs with energy and enthusiasm for nearly two hours the last night of camp.

If you have children—send them to camp! If you have an opportunity to participate in an activity at one of our camps—do it! And, while you're at it, Holy Shepherd, pat yourself on the back, because some of the financial gifts you share through our congregation are sent on to support the fine ministry our camps offer. Join us on Sundays at 9:30 for an adult bible study on Luther's 95 Theses, commencing September 10, 2017 and running for four successive weeks. This class will go in depth on the content and context of Martin Luther's 95 Theses, posted on October 31, 1517 as an invitation to theological debate. To understand the significance of the issues raised we will delve into the Catholic doctrines of purgatory and indulgences. We will learn of the importance of an obscure priest named Johann Tetzel whose preaching and actions directly led to Luther's posting of the theses, as well as the importance of the recent invention of the printing press to the momentum behind the reformation. The posting of the 95 theses was only a first step in Luther's journey guided by the radical thought that scripture trumped man's rules, and culminating in the five solas, the foundations of the Christian faith as taught by Jesus Christ. Come and learn a little Latin, a lot of theology. and just what those five pillars of the faith are. Free materials for all who attend.




Brad will also be leading the Adult Ed class on August 27<sup>th</sup> (9;30am, Library) to explain in more detail the Taize community.

# "Serving and Reaching Out Joyfully to All" My Story

I, Barb Jacobson, volunteer at the St. Francis Center in downtown Denver once a month. I pick up the food which is prepared at another facility and take it in my truck to the St. Francis Center for the soup kitchen clients. My main duty once at the center is to call clients up to get their food using a microphone. I have heard time and time again from the clients that "no one should ever go hungry in Denver!" What a blessing it is to hear that from the homeless. I have done this for eighteen years and it is very rewarding to serve those in need and share some laughs with them as well.



Every Monday morning I volunteer at the Action Center here in Lakewood. Shirley Bradsby introduced me to the facility 8 years ago. I was interested in the clothing area and have enjoyed measuring, marking, and hanging clothes for the clothing bank. My name tag includes my name and "Pant Lady" because I prefer working on pants - less judgment needed in style, etc., especially in men's.





Another enjoyable volunteering time is with Family Promise. I volunteer as one of the two evening hosts. It's fun to play Mexican Train, or

Chicken Tracks (domino games) with the adults who need to relax and get their minds off a lot of stress in their lives. It's wonderful that Holy Shepherd Lutheran can "house" these needy folks in a good setting.

Spring clean-up/service day is enjoyable as well. I enjoy volunteering with those who like to clean up the neighborhood, ditches, etc. Being close to Lakewood High School means we find some "waste" that escaped their hands and ends up on the ground!

The Holy Shepherd Busy Bees have made over 50 quilts since last January. They are all taken to the Urban Servant Corp and then shipped where needed throughout the world. When there is any kind of a disaster, you can bet that some of the Busy Bee Quilts will be there. These "utility quilts" are not only used for warmth, they provide shade in hot weather, a place to cover the ground or are used to hold and carry goods. These quilts are made and given to others in the spirit of love and caring.

The Busy Bees could use more fabric and more people to help. You don't need to be a seamstress or even know how to sew to join this group! We will find work for you. We meet on the second and fourth Tuesday mornings at 9AM in the Holy Shepherd multipurpose room in the basement.
